SAFETY / LAWS/ RULES & REGULATIONS

SAFETY FIRST:

There are 3 basic rules of safe gun handling:

- 1. Always point the muzzle in a safe direction; never point a firearm at anyone or anything you don't want to shoot.
- 2. Keep your finger off the trigger and outside of the trigger guard until you are ready to shoot.
- 3. Keep the action open and the gun unloaded until you are ready to use it.

LAWS:

Connecticut has recently passed a ban on high capacity magazines. You may not carry concealed more than 10 rounds in your magazine or pistol. We are hoping this law will be repealed but until then please be aware that you will be subject to arrest if you fail to comply. We have donated to the CCDL in the past and approved another donation in January to help their efforts. Check CCDL out at ccdl.us and the folks over at CTCarry.com have a wonderful website with lots of information. Keeping informed and raising your voice will help save our rights as legal, law abiding gun owners!

RULES & REGULATIONS:

Hunting on Club Property: Hunters are to abide by all rules in regard to entering and exiting the hunting grounds. Range operations are not to be interfered with in any way, shape or form.

Misfires and Debris: Misfires, live ammo and trash have been found on our ranges. Members must make sure to police their shooting area of all debris. This is **OUR** club and **WE** are all responsible for its upkeep. There are Misfire Cans and expended brass buckets on all ranges. A misfire is any cartridge that does not go off when fired. Misfires are considered live ammo and must be taken home or placed in a club Misfire Can for disposal. The residue from a fired cartridge is an expended brass or hull, in the case of shotguns, place any expended brass or hulls you are not taking home to reload in the brass bucket provided.

Drugs and Alcohol: are strictly FORBIDDEN on any club property!

Patterning Board: This is only for shotguns. Anyone caught using a pistol anywhere other than the pistol ranges will be expelled from the club.

Archery Hanging Targets: No broadheads of any type including but not



CLUB AMENITIES

The Club offers its members and their guests access to 2 skeet ranges, a trap field, an outdoor multipurpose rifle/pistol range, a 200 yard high power range, outdoor practical pistol and plinking ranges, an archery range and an indoor shooting gallery.

The Club supports a variety of junior and women's activities.

Shooting competitions in numerous disciplines are held at the club on a regular basis as are training programs in firearm and hunting safety.

HUNTING FACTS

Contributions in the form excise taxes paid on sporting firearms, ammo and archery equipment benefit every state and have generated approximately \$5.6 billion for wildlife conservation since 1939. The contribution for 2009 was a record at nearly \$336 million according to the US Fish & Wildlife Service which recently announced the Wildlife Restoration apportionment.

An average hunter spends \$1,638 every year on the sport

Quaker Hill Juniors

The Junior program is well underway. The juniors are beginning their fourth week of practice and are starting to get into the swing of things. With over 40 kids participating, roughly half of them are first time participants, the program shows solid growth. The robust nature of junior activity bodes well for the future of the club. A large and active membership lays the ground work for them growing into senior members who will make significant contributions to Quaker Hill when they are adults. Just one look at the roster of current officers and committee chairs who started out as juniors drives the point home. The juniors are the seed corn of the shooting sports and the club and we must nurture them accordingly.

The Junior club begins is match season in December and will close out the year in March.

PRACTICAL PISTOL

Winter shooting: When shooting on the right hand bay in the winter, please make sure when you leave you place all tables, chairs, etc used to one side of the range. This will allow the range to be plowed out when it snows and keep it cleared for everyone's enjoyment year round.

Winter Pin League: The winter outdoor league has started. It shoots on Saturdays at 1 PM and will run until the end of March. This is a .22 pistol (semi-auto and/or revolver) event. Entry fee will be \$10 per gun. This will be a bowling pin style league. The targets will be the special steel pin racks we have for the pin tables. Bowling pin league match rules apply. Contact Frank with any questions.

ConTact (Concealed Tactical): Defensive pistol matches are Saturday mornings. NOTE WINTER START TIME is 10 AM. Set up is at 9:30 so come early to help. Matches use IDPA targets and rules except for equipment - any reasonable, concealable carry gun is permitted. Hi-capacity magazines, ported barrels, low profile optical sights, etc. are OK. Usually shoot four scenarios per match, with from 6 to 18 rounds fired per scenario. If the weather forecast is iffy, on Friday email will be sent out to past participants informing them if match will be held or not. .22 Rimfire Plate Shoot: Dates will be, April 27, May 25, June 29, July 27, August 24, September 28 and October 26 (charity shoot). Shooting starts at 9:00 AM. Shooting will be one on one with each shooter having four 4"x 6" plates on the lower section, two 6"x 6" plates on the upper section to knock over first and then a 4"x 6" hinged tie breaking plate.
