# **SAFETY / LAWS/ RULES & REGULATIONS**

There are 3 basic rules of safe gun handling:

<u>ALWAYS</u> keep the gun pointed in a safe direction. <u>ALWAYS</u> keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot. <u>ALWAYS</u> keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

BE AWARE – For all those with their carry permit – If you are arrested for DWI/DUI in Connecticut, your right to carry will be suspended for a period of 5 years, 1<sup>st</sup> offense

**Range Rule Change:** ALL organized activities taking place on the practical pistol range will require chamber flags. There may be event exceptions, such as the CONTACT matches, that operate under specific safety procedures. While not required at this time for open shooting, it is STRONGLY urged for maximum safety, that chamber flags be used during open shooting too.

# **CLUB AMENITIES**

The Club offers its members and their guests' access to 2 skeet ranges, a trap field, an outdoor multipurpose rifle/pistol range, a 200 yard high power range, outdoor practical pistol and plinking ranges, an archery range and an indoor shooting gallery.

The Club supports a variety of junior and women's activities.

Shooting competitions in numerous disciplines are held at the club on a regular basis as are training programs in firearm and hunting safety.

# **HUNTING FACTS**

✓ Sportsmen contribute nearly \$8 million every day, adding more than \$2.9 billion every year for conservation.

✓ Hunters and target shooters have paid \$6.8 billion in excise taxes since the inception of the Pittman-Robertson Act in 1937.

✓ Hunting in America is big business, generating 600,000 jobs in the United States.

✓ For more than 80 years, sportsmen have paid more than \$13.7 billion for onthe-ground projects in every state, protecting our natural environment and our fish and wildlife.

✓ The \$4.95 billion in annual federal tax money generated by hunters' spending could cover the annual paychecks of 150,000 U.S. Army Sergeants.

**Charity Shoots**: Between the charity pin shoot, charity plate shoot and donations by other club members we raised \$500 and some toys for the children of Montville. Thank you to all those who participated and contributed to making this our most successful year ever.

**Fall .22 Pin League**: The .22 outdoor league is finished. In the revolver class, first place went to Tony Goulart, second to Mike McInerney, third to Allen Crouch and fourth to Scott Pierce. **Cowboy Pin Shoot**: On Saturday January 17 at 1 PM there will be a fun shoot using single action revolvers. Double action revolvers are allowed but you will have to shoot them single action. Up to two guns can be entered. IRON SIGHTS ONLY. NO OPTICS. If there is enough interest and time a lever action rifle (pistol calibers only) match will be held after the revolver match. Match rules and scoring will be reviewed prior to the start. If you need hours 2 pin setters are needed. We need to know who is going to attend. **ConTact (Concealed Tactical):** Defensive pistol matches are Saturday mornings. WE ARE BACK TO REGULAR START TIME. Set up at 9 AM, shooting starts at 9:30 so come early to help. Matches use IDPA targets and rules except for equipment - any reasonable, concealable carry gun is permitted. Hi-capacity magazines, ported barrels, low profile optical sights, etc. are OK. Usually shoot four scenarios per match, with from 6 to 18 rounds fired per scenario. #### **Coach Steve Rocketto**

Steve Rocketto, a Quaker Hill Life Member and the founder of the Quaker Hill Jr. Rifle Program and the Montville High School Rifle Club needs a successor.

He managed to get a high school rifle club established in Montville after two years of work and immense political opposition. However, he is old and getting gray and this team will disappear unless someone is willing to take over as coach. He is looking for a retired man or woman who likes working with kids.

If you volunteer, he is willing to train you over the next two years. No prior coaching skill is necessary. You will be taught all you need to know.

#### Here is what is required:

1. Three free hours on two afternoons per week from about 2:30 to 5:30. The season runs from October 1st to February 28th, about forty days of practice and competition.

2. Some minimal time necessary to keep some records and do paperwork.

The Montville Board of Education approved the activity with the provision that there would be no cost to the town so there is no financial reimbursement from Montville. However, Midway's Scholastic Shooting Fund has provided an endowment which nets the MHS Club about \$1,000 per year, much of which is used for League dues and match entry fees and Quaker Hill has been extremely generous in providing free range time, equipment, ammunition, and targets. The team, which numbers about eight to 16 shooters, is very well equipped.

Any club member willing to step up and take the challenge should contact The E Board or a trustee. Anyone interested in seeing what we do is invited to attend a practice session on Monday or Wednesday between 3 PM and 5:30 PM.
